From the Pastor's Desk Remembering Mother Columba



Mother Columba, formerly of Newtowncashel, Longford, Ireland, entered Religious life in 1939. A request came for the Sisters to staff a Parish/School in Berlin, NJ called Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. A novena was prayed and on Ascension Thursday, 1956, Mother Columba was assigned to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel as principal and Superior of the Convent.

Mother remained at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel until 1964 when she was called back to Trim, Ireland to be part of leadership in her community, the Sisters of Mercy.

Mother continued her involvement in Education, founding a Mercy School for girls in Trim. Mother also was Head of Finance for the order and remained in education most of her career.

Mother Columba is a true pioneer in our Parish, who was instrumental in our children's education. To quote Bea Jackson, part of the first class to graduate from OLMC,"We remember Mother Columba's sparkling eyes, electric smile and gentle demeanor". Mother/Sister Columba died on Ascension Thursday 2013 at the age of 92.
