On behalf of the staff of the Special Projects Department at Gloucester County Special Services School District, I would like to extend my deepest appreciation to you and the members of Saint Simon Stock Parish. Your recent donations of bathing suits, towels, clothing, toys, books and food for the students in our Migrant Education Program were overwhelmingly generous.

The migrant children who are enrolled in our summer programs in the Hammonton and Bridgeton areas move frequently throughout the summer months so that their parents can find work on farms to support their families. Many reside in sub-standard housing or on farm labor camps. Most of these families struggle daily to afford even basic necessities, making it very difficult for them to purchase items such as the bathing suits and towels that the children need for our summer after-school camp programs. In addition, budget cuts have made it increasingly difficult for us to use program funds to purchase camp supplies such as pool toys and arts and crafts materials for our students. We are also excited to have donations of books so that we can give each student a book or two to take with them on their travels.

The food donations from your parish are also much appreciated as many families arrive with limited food supplies and often have to wait a few weeks before receiving a pay check. Having some non-perishable food items on hand helps us to quickly assist those most in need as food pantries are often not open on a daily basis and many of the families lack transportation.

The children and families whom we serve will be richly rewarded by the generosity and kindness of your parish members. The staff here is deeply touched by your efforts to reach out to this underserved, disadvantaged population. Your efforts will make a difference in the lives of these children this summer and your support is truly appreciated.

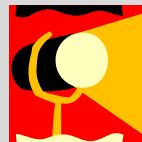


