A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

“God who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ - by grace you have been saved, raised up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus.”

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has constantly reminded us that the greatest virtue is mercy. All other virtues surround it.

St. Paul told the Ephesians, and us, that because of mercy, we have salvation in Christ Jesus. This comes to us through grace, which is the life of God, given as a gift, not earned, but accepted.

How often we take this gift for granted. How rarely do we recognize the gift of God’s grace in others. How rapidly we gloss over the inspired words which Paul included in his letter, words like ‘brought to life’, immeasurable riches, His kindness.

Reflecting upon The Word will strengthen us to continue our Lenten journey, for it is in completion of the paschal mystery where we place our hope.

Yes, ‘we are His handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.’ ‘Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.’



Reaching Out

Every human being is the object of God’s infinite tenderness, and he himself is present in their lives. Jesus offered his precious blood on the cross for that person.

Joy of the Gospel

Lord, I know that you gave your life for all people, but two things make it hard to believe: myself and certain other people. As St. Paul said, “It’s relatively easy to understand dying for a good person-a Mother Theresa or Francis of Assisi-but the rest of us? Not so much. Yet you did it for me, for the drug dealer, murderer, swindler and all the rest. May I never doubt that, especially when I am dealing with the suffering poor. Amen

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

The people of Judah practiced many abominations, even polluting God's temple in Jerusalem. They mocked the messengers he sent among them, until he grew so angry he delivered them to the King of the Chaldeans. Those who weren't killed were exiled and became servants for seventy years. Cyrus, King of Persia, was ordered to build a temple to God in Jerusalem, and he freed the servants as God had inspired him to do.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10

Paul declares that God brought us to life in Jesus, though we had been dead from our sins. He reminds us that it was not a reward for our good service so no one should take credit. Instead, we must remember that it was not our doing, but a sign of God's mercy and love for us.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

God so loved the world, he sent us his only Son so that all who believed would have eternal life in him. The light came into the world, but those who were wicked avoided it, for fear that their evil deeds would be exposed. But those who believed were unafraid of the light, where it would be clear that their deeds were done in God.

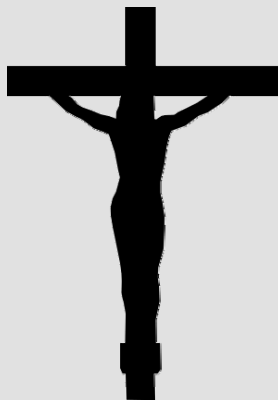
