First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Isaiah tells of the Lord's Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God's will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

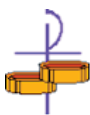

Session 2: What is Catholic Social Teaching?

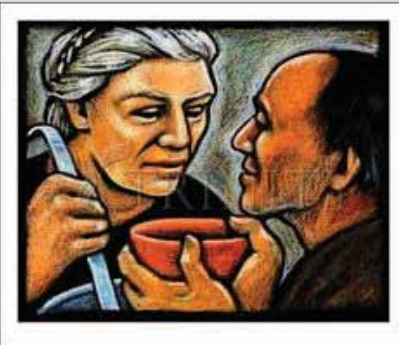

Parish Nursing Update

As you may be aware, a group of very dedicated parishioners, who also happen to be nurses have been meeting to form a healthcare ministry for our faith community. To date, we have begun to develop this ministry to provide support to enhance community wellness as well as help those in need to navigate through the challenges of healthcare today. Please note that while we are not yet an active ministry, we thought it best to keep you apprised of our progress.

Hopefully, the ministry will begin providing some parish services mid-spring of 2016. Those services will include:

1. Blood Pressure Screenings on a monthly or quarterly basis.
2. Health & Wellness education programs.
